

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

This year our Operation Christmas Children emphasis, where a shoebox is filled with gifts, love and prayer, will run from today through November 10th.

There are several ways you can support this ministry effort:

- 1) You can take one of the OCC boxes and fill it for a child in these age categories: 2-4, 5-9 or 10-14. You pick the age and whether it's for a boy or girl. Mark the shoebox label and tape it to your shoebox, drop the box off in the vestibule. Fill as many boxes as you are able.
- 2) It costs \$10 per box to ship to another country, to a child in need. - 3) Although we are not collectively filling boxes this year, there are folks here that will fill a box for you. You choose boy/girl, the age category and provide the money and someone will shop for you. Please see Cindy if you are interested.
- 4) Any checks to PVBC marked for OCC but not specifically earmarked shoebox supplies, will be given to Samaritan's Purse for postage. We encourage you to give generously.

Question 1 – Constitutional Amendment (Ch. 245 of the 2023 Legislative Session) Declaration of Rights – Right to Reproductive Freedom

The proposed amendment confirms an individual's fundamental right to reproductive freedom, including but not limited to the ability to make and effectuate decisions to prevent, continue, or end the individual's pregnancy, and provides the State may not, directly or indirectly, deny, burden, or abridge the right unless justified by a compelling State interest achieved by the least restrictive means.

Words Matter

- No minimum age, male or female
- No definition of "reproductive freedom"
- · Not limited to abortion
- No parental consent requirements
- Maryland taxpayers will bear the financial "burden" of these new rights

Important Note: A "No" vote maintains Maryland's current abortion-through-birth and trans healthcare rights for adults. A "Yes" vote creates these rights for children without parental consent.
